

Coast Town Tips

As for exploring the town itself, aim for early mornings or after 6 pm. This strategy allows you to avoid the peak crowds and enjoy a more relaxed atmosphere.

If you have a penchant for Italian fashion—both for yourself and your little ones—prepare to be tempted beyond belief. The shops in the area are a treasure trove of stylish options, featuring abundant lemon-themed attire, as well as a palette of blues and whites that capture the coastal spirit.

I'd also look into boat transportation between villages, as traffic is extremely heavy, especially at high times.

FROM THE U.S.

We took a private car service from Rome to Sorrento, a journey of about 3.5 hours. One highlight of the drive is the chance to stop at an Autogrill, Italy's upscale version of a rest stop. Unlike typical rest stops, the Autogrill offers clean bathrooms and an impressive selection of fresh food. Besides meals, you can shop for gifts, toys, and groceries, refuel your car, and take a restroom break. However, if your ultimate destination is the Amalfi Coast, I'd recommend flying directly to Naples. If you choose this option, it's wise to book a private car service in advance.

TO THE U.S.

We concluded our trip in Rome, so it was logical to depart from there. I recommend taking a moment to inform your driver about your airline to avoid being dropped off at the wrong terminal, as we experienced. Italians are exceptionally family-friendly. Traveling with our 3-year-old, we brought along a stroller for easier airport navigation. To our delight, this led to us being fast-tracked through security and customs—a wonderful perk!

GROUNDS

The hotel is simply extraordinary. The team was first-class from the time that we arrived until we checked out on our way to Rome. The hotel has a playground, but not one that we are used to in the U.S. No swings or climbingwalls, but big open spaces for picnics and running. Hammocks swinging from trees made the perfect spot for a book lover to enjoy! Though I didn't indulge in the spa, its transformation from an old greenhouse to a luxury retreat definitely caught my eye ... and so did a few items to purchase!

Our room was impeccable, accommodating three adults and a child for a week. The four sets of French doors opened up to a wrap-around patio and deck with a scenic view of the gardens. The convenience of a private side entrance, avoiding the main lobby hustle, was a nice touch.

The lobby terrace is a dream, offering a mesmerizing view of the Bay of Naples - a sight I admired daily. Coupled with the pool and its adjoining cafe set amidst lemon trees, relaxation was inevitable. Every staff member, from servers to bartenders, showcased genuine care and attention, making our stay even more delightful.

Common areas, like the intimate bar off the lobby and cozy seating spots, were ideal for catching up with friends. The hotel's private elevator leading to the marina and beach underscored its luxury. All in all, a top-tier experience.
